1	1116	CUB	How to Create Positive and Constructive Den and Pack Meetings	For all Cub Scout Leaders (1 Session Long). Discover techniques to create positive, active and constructive Den and Pack Meetings. Encourage good behavior, participation, attendance and fun through structured, pro active planning.
1	1117	CUB	Engaging Your Parents in Cub Scouting	For all Cub Scout Leaders (1 Session Long). Learn ways to inspire your parents to volunteer in your dens and pack committee.

1	1123	BSA	Courts of Honors and Ceremonies	For all Scout Leaders (1 Session Long). Every Scout and Leader should be recognized for their accomplishments. Learn how to make these recognitions meaningful and memorable with help on preparing Courts of Honor and ceremonies including neckerchief ceremonies when a scout enters a troop, or a special ceremony for scouts aging out.
1	1124	BSA	Let's Get Cooking - Cooking MB in Troop Program	For Scoutmasters/ASM, MB Counselors, Scouts (1 Session Long). Cooking Merit Badge became Eagle Required in 2010 and the requirements have changed several times. Learn ways to incorporate the Merit Badge into your Troop program and outings.

1	1125	BSA	Adults Transitioning to Scouts BSA	For Cubmasters, Webelos Den Leaders, SM, ASM (1 Session Long). Many times, the transition from Cub Scouts to Scouts BSA is harder on a scout's parents than on the scout. In this course, we will focus on ways to make the transition easier for Mom & Dad. The more the parents understand the Scouts BSA program the more likely you are to retain scouts and increase your volunteer base in your unit.
1	1126	BSA	Service Projects	For all Scout Leaders (1 Session Long). Be one of the first in the nation to learn about how a Scout can incorporate 21st century technology like drone or KAP technology to map areas or track wildlife as a conservation service project. See <a href="http://hornadayaward.org">hornadayaward.org</a> to learn more about this program.
1	1327	BSA	Den Chief Training (For Youth)	For current or future Den Chiefs (3 Sessions Long). What is a den chief and how can a den chief help a Cub Scout den "go and grow." This is a hands on course for prospective den chiefs to fulfill the Leadership requirements for their Scout rank advancement. Every Cub Scout needs a trained Den Chief.
1	1528	BSA	Scoutmaster and Assistant Scoutmaster Position Specific Training	For new SM/ASM (5 Sessions Long). Basic training needed for anyone taking the SM/ASM position in a troop. Learn the important fundamentals of the job and how training can improve your Troop.
1	1329	BSA	ILST - Introduction to Leadership Skills for Troops (For Youth)	For Scouts BSA Youth Leaders (3 Sessions Long). This course will teach Scouts with leadership positions about their new roles and how to effectively reach success in that role. It is intended to help Scouts in leadership positions within their troop understand their responsibilities and to equip them with organizational and leadership skills to fulfill those responsibilities. Completion of ILST is a prerequisite for Scouts to participate in the more advanced leadership courses National Youth Leadership Training (NYLT) and the National Advanced Youth Leadership Experience (NAYLE). It is also required to participate in a Kodiak Challenge Trek.
1	1631	VEN	Venturing Leader Specific Training - VLST (For Adults and Youth)	For Adult Leaders and Youth Crew Presidents (6 Sessions Long). "Every Venturer deserves a trained leader". This is REQUIRED training for Advisors and Associate Advisors who have not taken position specific training. Youth crew presidents are encouraged to attend this course as well. Learn more about the Venturing program -- organization and leadership, awards, and advancement. Bring back new and exciting program ideas to your Crew. Course will share some training time with VEN 1632 when syllabus material overlaps.

1	1632	VEN	Introduction to Leadership Skills for Crews - ILSC (For Adults and Youth)	For all Venturing Youth and Adult Leaders (6 Sessions Long). ILSC is the first course in the series of leadership training offered to Venturers. Learn about crew organization, vision and values, servant leadership, and core skills (communication, planning, teaching, team development). Completion of ILSC is a prerequisite for Venturers to participate in the more advanced leadership courses, including Kodiak, National Youth Leadership Training (NYLT) and National Advanced Youth Leadership Experience (NAYLE). Course will also include Goal Setting and Time Management training (required for Discovery Award), as well as Mentoring training (required for Summit Award).
1	1141	OUT	Safe Swim Defense	For all Adult Leaders (1 Session Long). Before a BSA group may engage in swimming activities of any kind, at least one adult leader must have completed Safe Swim Defense training. The material covered is the same as the online course, done live. On completion, each adult will get an SSD card, and be registered as Trained in SSD.
1	1142	OUT	Gear 101	For all Scouters (1 Session Long). Do you really know gear? How do you pick the right sleeping bag? What is the difference with water purifiers? Will this tent work? Course will discuss characteristics of primary gear and what to look for and consider.
1	1143	OUT	Snow Camping	For all Adult Leaders (1 Session Long). Explore the wonders of snow camping. Course will provide an introduction to the basics of snow camping, how to do it, safety concerns and suitable locations.
1	1144	OUT	Orienteering	For all Adult Leaders (1 Session Long). This back to the basics course covers the knowledge required to use a map and compass and the skills needed for the Second Class rank advancement. Teaches the essential techniques for effective navigation while trekking, and a necessary survival skill when the use of a GPS just won't do. Course is also good for Webelos Leaders.
1	1345	OUT	Outdoor Ethics 101 (For Youth and Adults)	For older Scouts and all Adults (3 Sessions Long). This course provides an in depth introduction to Leave No Trace (LNT) and Outdoor Ethics (OE). The course is structured around the seven principles of LNT including the relationships between Tread Lightly!, LNT and OE. A mix of lecture and hands-on activities will help participants understand the importance of Outdoor Ethics in the Scouting program and includes where to find additional resources. It is particularly valuable for Outdoor Ethics Guides and for Leaders coaching OE Guides who have not yet completed the 17-hour Leave No Trace trainer course. Completion of this course qualifies a person to conduct Outdoor Ethics activities including those needed for the Outdoor Ethics Awareness Award.
1	1151	CED	Community Service	For all Scout Leaders (1 Session Long). How do units "Do a Good Turn Daily?" Why do we do it? What are some examples of community service? What kinds of service are appropriate for Cubs, Scouts and Venturers? Come to this session for new ideas and to share what your unit does.

1	1252	CED	Introduction to CERT (Community Emergency Response Team) and Emergency Preparedness	For all Adults (2 Sessions Long). What is CERT and how it relates to you, your Troop and your community. How to get started in preparing yourself and your home for emergencies from A to Z, with a perspective from top to bottom preparedness for all emergencies. Get ready for responding after a disaster hits by making your home hazmat and utility safe and making your own kit. Introduction to the Incident Command System also known as the Standardized Emergency Management System (SEMS) and National Incident Management System (NIMS). Learn the components to the system and what they are assigned to do so that a mission can be accomplished with a plan, organization, and accountability.
1	1153	CED	Unit Communication	For all Scout Leaders (1 Session Long). How to utilize the variety of today's communication methods to make the most impact within your Pack, Troop or Crew.
1	1155	CED	Exploring 101	For all Adult Leaders (1 Session Long). Exploring...Learning for Life. Do Scouts and Scouters know this word or phrase? What does it have to do with scouting in general? Could Venturers and Scouts still work on advancement and be an Explorer at the same time? Career interests? How does Exploring meet and address these concerns and questions?
1	1356	CED	American Red Cross CPR/AED	For all leaders (Youth and Adult) (3 Sessions Long). This is hands-on skills training that prepares you to respond to breathing and cardiac emergencies. It also teaches the skills and knowledge needed to provide care for victims of sudden cardiac arrest through the safe use of an automated external defibrillator (AED). The certification lasts for two years starting the day of the course. There is no First Aid training with this course. <b>(\$10 additional fee due at course)</b>
1	1157	CED	STEM-in-a-BOX	For all Adult Leaders (1 Session Long). Wondering how to implement STEM in your unit, be it a Pack, a Troop, or a Crew? We will show how units across the Council are doing just that. We will demonstrate the STEM-in-a-BOX that will assist leaders in bringing STEM to their units. Learn to stop fearing STEM and love it!
1	1158	CED	How to get your unit up and running on SCOUTBOOK	For Adult Leaders using SCOUTBOOK administratively and Key 3 (1 Session Long). Introduction to the BSA-supported software for tracking scout advancement, communications, calendar, and more.
2	2112	CUB	Whittling Chip	For all Cub Scout Leaders (1 Session Long). Learn to teach safe knife use and carving to your Cubs - requirements for Bear and Arrow of Light. Please bring a pocketknife and sharpening stone if you can.

3	3143	OUT	Introduction to Backpacking	For Scouts BSA, Varsity, and Venturing Leaders (1 Session Long). Backpacking can be enjoyable for scout(er)s of all ages. Learn how to ease them into becoming self-sufficient in the wilderness.

3	3158	CED	Advanced SCOUTBOOK Tricks	For all Adult Leaders (1 Session Long). <b>NEW 2019.</b> This course will cover advancement tips for those who are already using SCOUTBOOK and want to learn some add-on tools and reporting tools they can use in their Units.
4	4111	CUB	Tiger Den Leader 411	For current and future Tiger Den Leaders (1 Session Long). How to use the Tiger Adventure Program, den organization, how to share the load among den parents, and tips to make your meetings fun.
